

B) Formal Intervenor

An intervenor is a person or group who wishes to fully participate in the hearing, including presenting evidence and/or cross-examining witnesses.

- You may request formal standing as an Intervenor, subject to Board approval. This will allow you to present evidence and question witnesses. Your request must be received by the Board by **16h30 on December 19th, 2025**, and, if approved, intervenors intending to present written, visual or electronic evidence must provide that evidence as directed **under Rule 6 of the Rules of Procedure Respecting Adjudicative Hearings**, to the Board by **16h30 on February 9th, 2026**.
- Individuals **may not submit** an individual application and then also be part of a group application for intervenor status.
- If an individual or group is granted intervenor status, **they may not also participate as a member of the general public by submitting a written statement or by requesting to present an oral statement.**
